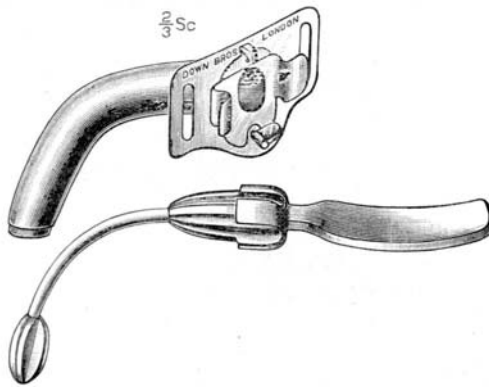

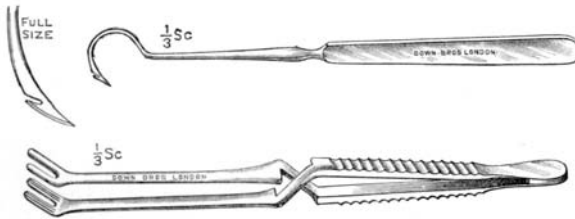


A NEW TRACHEOTOMY TUBE
