I have been a mental health advocate since I came out of a mental hospital in New York in 1980. My most recent activities were being the protagonist in the movie Bipolar by psychiatrist and filmmaker Dr.Ernst Juenger (www.bipolar.de/bipolar) and being a panel discussant at the World Health Summit in Berlin (Oct 15-18, 2009). I also participated in a round-table discussion organized by the Kanton of Zug on bipolar illness in Zug, Switzerland on November 8, 2009.
