In this volume, Benjamin Newcomb applies the "new" political history—especially quantitative methodology—to political activity in the colonies of New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania from 1700 to the beginning of the Revolution. Close analysis of a great array of sources leads him to conclude that political partisanship was much stronger, more extensive, and more enduring in the middle fifty years of the eighteenth century than historians have heretofore believed. 328 pp, £35.00 hb
