

Call for Manuscripts on Women's/Gender History in the Gilded Age & Progressive Era

The *Journal of the Gilded Age and Progressive Era* invites submissions for a planned special issue around the theme, "Women's and Gender History in Global Context." Any subject is welcome, so long as the manuscript in some way addresses the theme, focuses on the period covered by the journal, roughly 1870-1920, and has a U.S. component. Manuscripts may adopt a transnational perspective, view the United States from a comparative or international point of view, or focus on issues of empire. Submissions are welcome from scholars based in the United States or in other countries. Manuscripts will be peer-reviewed, with final contents selected by a committee drawn from the journal's editorial and executive board. Society for Historians of the Gilded Age and Progressive Era The 2012 Fishel-Calhoun Prize

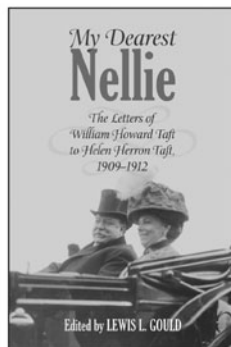
The Society for Historians of the Gilded Age and Progressive Era (SHGAPE) announces its biennial competition for the Fishel-Calhoun Prize for the best article dealing with any aspect of United States history between 1865 and 1917. The prize is open to new scholars, defined as graduate students or PhDs who received their doctorate since 2002 and who have not yet published a book. The article must have appeared in a journal dated 2010 or 2011. The winner of the prize will receive \$250 and is asked to serve on the next Fishel-Calhoun Prize Committee. An article may be submitted for consideration by the author or by others (e.g., a journal editor). Deadline: December 15, 2011. The prize will be awarded at the SHGAPE luncheon at the OAH meeting, Milwaukee, April 19-22, 2012. Please submit three off-prints, photocopies, or a PDF of the article (page proofs are acceptable for articles scheduled to appear in December 2011), a copy of the table of contents of the issue in which it appeared, and a current email address for the author.
