Africana Monographs

The African Studies Center at Michigan State University intends to publish from two to four monographs a year in the various disciplines that constitute African Studies. Each book must, however, have an importance that transcends the bounds of its academic discipline. Africanists generally must recognize the importance of the particular work. To ensure the interdisciplinary perspective, the African Studies Center will obtain evaluations not only from specialists in the author's discipline, but also from a board of editors that will test the vitality of the work in relationship to general African studies. Thus, a submitted manuscript will be read by an editorial board of specialists and generalists.

The African Studies Center will consider publishing works in the range of 35,000 to 75,000 words (80 to 200 printed pages), although smaller or larger studies may occasionally be issued. Manuscripts should be double-spaced with large margins, and at least four copies ought to be submitted. Normally the editor will only consider works in English, but important contributions in German and French may be published.

The number of each monograph to be published will depend upon the study, but at least 500 of each book will be printed. Even though the African Studies Center intends to keep prices low, absorbing many of the costs in its overhead, the quality of production will be high. Authors will not be compensated for their books, but they will receive twenty-five free copies, and the African Studies Center will send out as many as another twenty-five review copies to journals of the author's choice.

The African Studies Center intends to begin publication in this monograph series by September 1975. It cordially invites authors in all disciplines to submit manuscripts as soon as possible to:

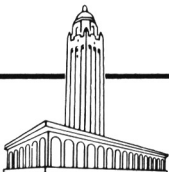
