The Centennial Conference on Laryngeal Cancer will be held in Toronto, Canada, 26-31 May 1974.

The scientific programme will feature internationally renowned authorities in surgery, radiotherapy, pathology, and will encompass the knowledge accumulated on laryngeal cancer since the first laryngectomy a century ago.

The aim of the Conference is to resolve the differences of opinion as to the treatment of cancer of the larynx, to establish guidelines for research and to contribute to better methods of early diagnosis of the disease.

COURSE IN LARYNGOLOGY AND BRONCHOESOPHAGOLOGY
