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HIROSHI WAGATSUMA was Professor of Cultural Anthropology of the Tokyo Institute of Technology at the time of his death in July 1985. Before returning to Japan in 1980, he lived in the United States for many years and taught at a number of American universities, most notably as Professor of Anthropology at the University of California, Los Angeles, and the University of Pittsburgh. His many publications emphasized his longstanding interest in the treatment of minority groups in Japan and Japanese social psychology.

KIRK R. WILLIAMS is Associate Professor of Sociology at the University of New Hampshire, Durham. He has published articles on the perceptions of legal sanctions as well as the structural and cultural sources of violence in society. He is currently directing two major research projects in collaboration with Murray A. Straus: One is a national panel study of deterrence and violence between adult partners, funded by the National Science Foundation, and the other is a comparative study of homicide in the United States from 1976 to 1984, funded by the National Institute of Justice.
