Membership in the Association for Asian Studies, a scholarly, non-political and non-profit organization, is open to all persons interested in Asia and the scholarly study of Asia. Annual membership dues are \$25 for Regular members, \$12.50 for Retired members, and \$12.50 for Student members. Student membership is restricted to full-time students for a maximum of five years. Regular, Retired, and Student members receive the *Journal of Asian Studies* and the *Asian Studies Newsletter*.

Manuscripts should be typed on 8 1/2 × 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in *A Manual of Style*, 12th ed. (Chicago: Univ. of Chicago Press, 1969), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than 50 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
