## **Bureaucrat and Intellectual in the Ottoman Empire**

The Historian Mustafa Âli  
(1541–1600)

Mustafa Âli was the foremost historian of the sixteenth-century Ottoman Empire, the first systematic critic of Ottoman administration, and the formulator of what later became the accepted Ottoman ideology of classical greatness and decline. Âli's career as a servant of the dynasty spanned the range of elite professions—religious, bureaucratic, and military—as well as the reigns of four sultans from Süleyman the Lawgiver to Mehmed III. Most modern scholars of the Ottoman period have focused on economic and institutional issues, but this ground-breaking study (one of the few biographies in the Islamic field as a whole) uses Âli and his works as the basis for analyzing the nature of intellectual and social life in a formative period of the Ottoman Empire.
