## Cocoa, Custom and Socioeconomic Change in Rural Western Nigeria

Cocoa is Western Nigeria's main export crop, and the spread of its production since the late nineteenth century has contributed to the commercialization and diversification of the rural economy; at the same time it has strengthened some of the institutional characteristics of pre-colonial Yoruba society. This study suggests a reinterpretation of conventional explanations of West African export growth, and also examines the implications for the relationship of the rural sector to the economy as a whole and for current issues of rural development policy. £7 *Oxford Studies in African Affairs*
