This authoritative guide to published works in African studies has been published annually since 1984. The *Africa Bibliography* includes a wide range of material: books, articles in journals, and book chapters, covering the whole of Africa. It lists works published in a number of languages, such as Portuguese, Swahili, French and German, as well as English; categorises by region, country and subject; and includes an author index and a detailed thematic index. The *Africa Bibliography* records publications on Africa of interest to students of Africa, principally in the social and environmental sciences, humanities and arts; though some items from the medical, biological and natural sciences, likely to be of interest to a reader from a social science/arts background, are included. This annual publication records the previous year's work in its field, with provision for retrospective inclusion of earlier items. It is prepared in association with the International African Institute's journal *Africa*.

Richard E. Bartholomew is a bibliographer who has a PhD in the Study of Religion from SOAS, University of London. He also works as a book indexer and copy editor, and he has published on religion and media.

The *Africa Bibliography* is available as a fully searchable database of all volumes published to date.
