Dr Joseph James, D.D.S., F.R.C.S., D.Sc.,

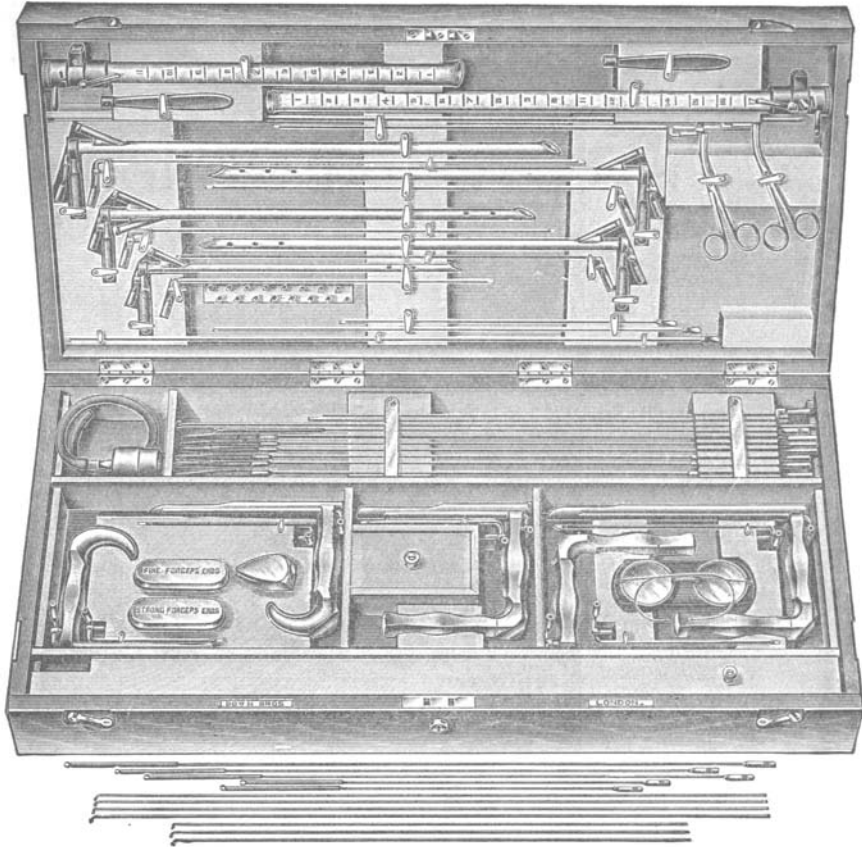

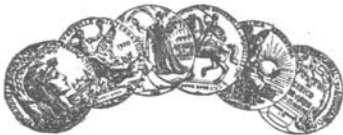

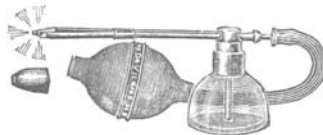
