Papers may also treat more general theoretical and methodological issues with relevance to Latin America. Authors submit manuscripts to the editor for consideration as ARTICLES or REPORTS in English, Spanish, or Portuguese. Authors should submit an original and three copies of their manuscripts (including all figures, tables, references, and notes), along with an abstract in both English and Spanish.
