Extract from an Article on

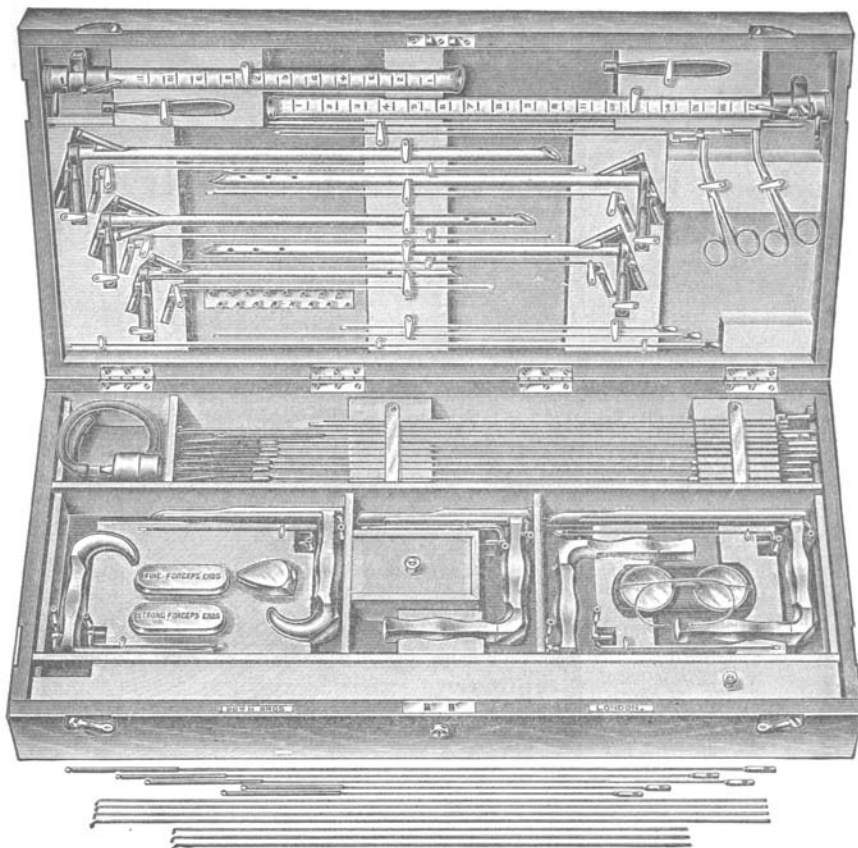

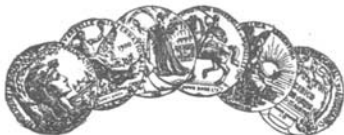

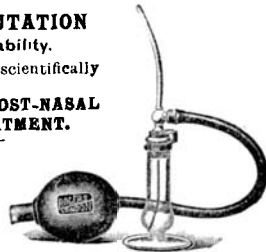

Major operations are performed daily, except Mondays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. 
