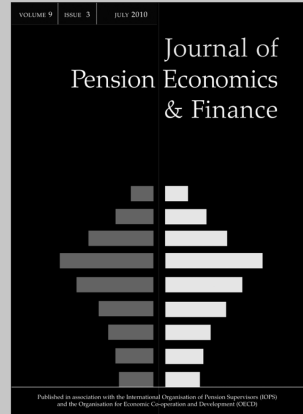
The journal publishes original research papers, covering a variety of topics, including pension fund management, the regulation of pensions, and pensions and labour markets.

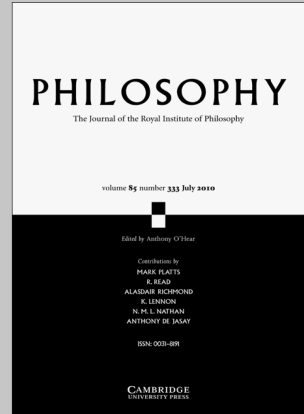

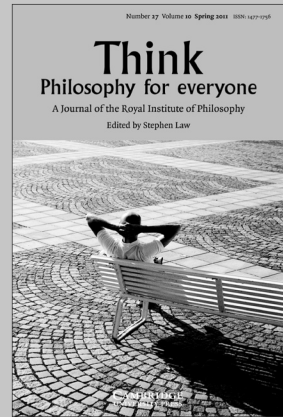

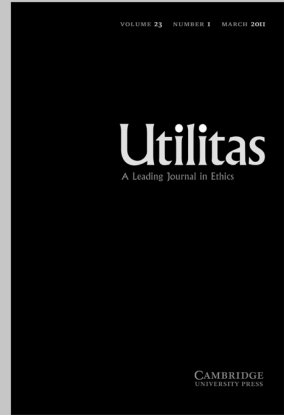
