This reprint of Copernicus' famous work is a facsimile of the copy of the original 1543 edition belonging to the University Library in Leipzig. This particular copy is unique in that it once had been the property of Johannes Kepler, who inserted a large number of marginal notes and, more important, an introduction, written in dialogue style.

This particular copy of *De Revolutionibus*, which has been inaccessible to the great majority of Copernican researchers for many years, proved invaluable to Kepler in his defense of Copernicus, and to Ludwig Birkenmajer, Gerhard Harig, and others, in later studies.



The new introduction discusses the history of the Leipzig copy, and furnishes a complete bibliography of editions published after 1543.
