Advaita Vedānta is historically and currently the most important and pervasive philosophical system in India. It encompasses a discipline of spiritual experience as well as a technical philosophy, and since the time of Sāṃkara in the ninth century some of the greatest intellects in India have contributed to its development. Covering the basic metaphysical, epistemological, and ethical ideas of Vedānta, Eliot Deutsch in his reconstruction has here lifted the system out of its historical-cultural context and has concentrated attention on those ideas which have universal and enduring philosophical value.
