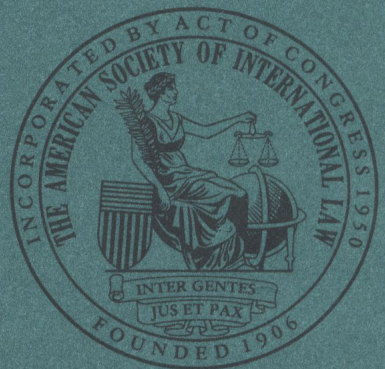

PATRONAGE, GIFTS AND BEQUESTS

Whiteman (1985) and Leo Gross (1986).
