Imma Maddox writes: 'I was born on the 28th March 1955. This image of a schizophrenic head was taken from a lino print I created at the age of 14 and it seems to anticipate the later development of my schizophrenic illness in 1975. The face is half male and half female, half light and half dark. I reworked the image in 1988 as this print and in 1995–7 as three different rugs, one of which is in the Bethlem Museum, one in the artist's possession and one in a private collection.
