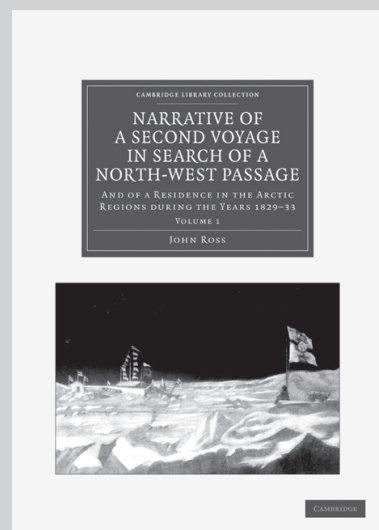

Over a hundred published titles include works by Nansen, Ross, Scoresby and Franklin, and a further ninety volumes, by authors including Amundsen and Scott, are in preparation.
