ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING

International workshop on the reproductive ecology of tropical forest plants

Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Bangi, Malaysia 8-12 June 1987

This workshop aims to bring together research scientists and forest managers working in different parts of the tropics for a pan-tropical review of recent developments in the field, and to discuss how insights gained from research can assist the management of tropical forest resources. Topics to be covered include reproductive rythms, plant-pollinator interactions, seed dispersal and seedling ecology, and the implications for natural forest management and for plantation forestry.

The workshop is sponsored by the Man and Biosphere Programme (MAB) of UNESCO and the Decade of the Tropics Programme of the International Union of Biological Sciences (IUBS), in collaboration with the Malaysian MAB National Committee. It is planned in conjunction with the MAB/IUBS workshop on *Rain forest regeneration and management* to be held in Caracas in November 1986.

The workshop is being organized by a Scientific Committee headed by Dr Kamal Bawa of the University of Massachusetts - Boston, and a local Organizing Committee under the leadership of Dr Noraini Tamin of UKM. Contributed papers are solicited, and abstracts should be provided by November 1986.
