Statement of Purpose

Religion and American Culture: A Journal of Interpretation explores the interplay between religion and other spheres of American culture. Although concentrated on specific topics, articles illuminate larger patterns, implications, or contexts of American life. *Religion and American Culture* is, thus, devoted to promoting the ongoing scholarly discussion of the nature, terms, and dynamics of religion in America.

Surface postage for subscriptions outside the USA is \$7.00 (£3.50) per volume. Single issues are available to institutions at \$20.00 (£10.00) each and to individuals at \$10.00 (£5.00) each, plus \$1.75 (£1.40) per issue for postage. A forty percent discount is available on bulk orders for classroom use or bookstore sales.
