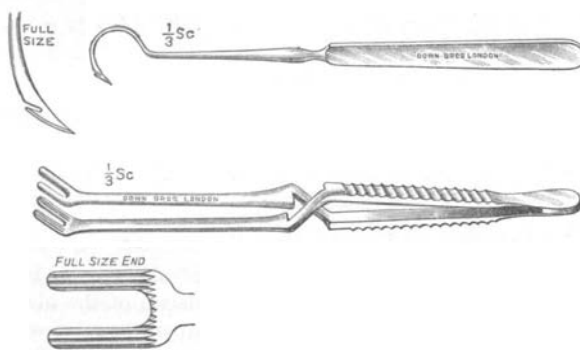

## HEMOPLASTIN

(HÆMOSTATIC SERUM)
