The Kingdom of Nupe in Nigeria

By S. F. NADEL. 25s. net

The West African society dealt with in this book is half a million strong. It is far from being either 'simple' or 'primitive'. Its social and economic complexity is comparable only with the civilization of Imperial Rome, Byzantium, or Medieval Europe. But very few historical records exist; the people of Nupe have not yet risen to the stage of education which can produce written records of important events or institutions. The book contains maps and illustrations.

A Study of the Pattern of Lovedu Society

By E. J. AND J. D. KRIGE. 21s. net

This book presents the life and culture to-day of the Lovedu, a Bantu tribe in the Northern Transvaal. The central figure of the Lovedu is their sacred queen, Mujaji the Rain-Maker (Rider Haggard's *She*), who by tribal custom is destined to die by her own hand. The authors are trained anthropologists who worked in the field over a period of ten years, latterly under a Fellowship of the International Institute of African Languages and Cultures.
