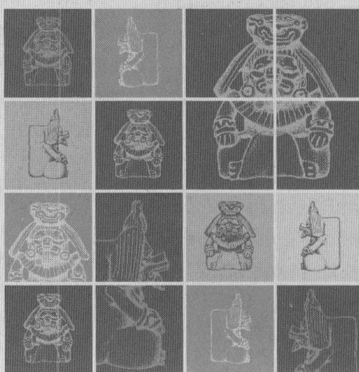


# LATIN AMERICAN ANTIQUITY

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*On the cover:* The cover shows objects from the Locarno Beach culture type—a basket of split cedar withes recovered from a wet site in the Fraser Delta of southwestern British Columbia and three views of a barbed bone point made from an elk, or wapiti (*Cervus elaphus*), cannon bone from another site nearby. The Locarno Beach phase dates from 3400 to 2500 B.P. and is the first Northwest Coast culture to rely extensively on stored salmon.
