Brought into contact with European economic, social, and colonial systems, they are undergoing a process of rural transformation that ties them to regional, national, and international milieus far beyond the scope of their traditional experience. *Ecology and Change: Rural Modernization in an African Community* is concerned with understanding and modeling the nature and results of that change.

The book analyzes the processes and patterns of change from four viewpoints:

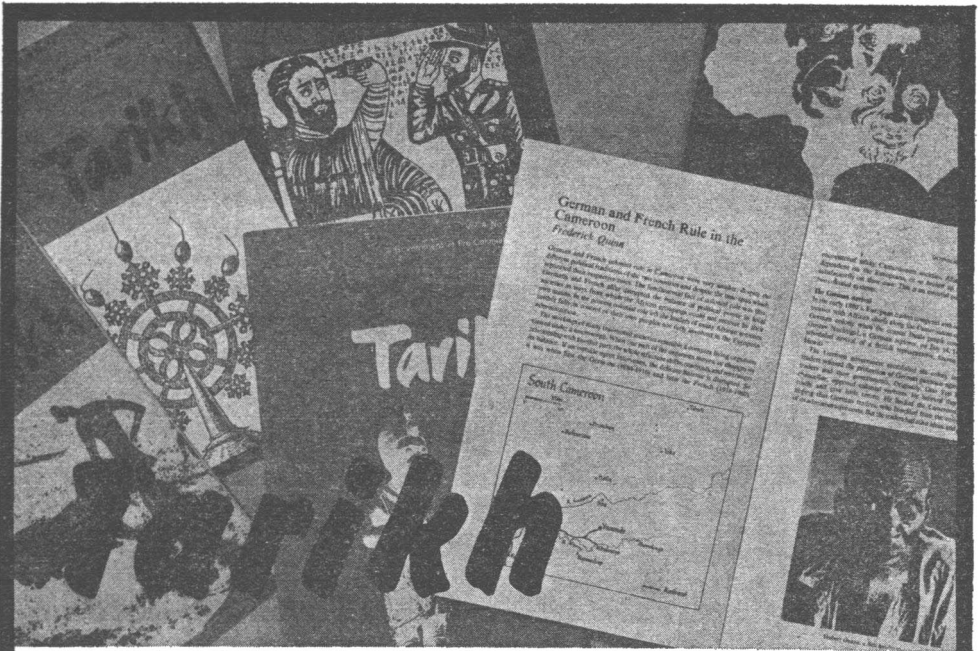
- A *Cultural Perspective* focuses on Nyiha agricultural tradition, thought, decision-making, and activity within a cultural and environmental framework;
- An *Ecological Perspective* demonstrates the fundamental functioning of Nyiha agricultural systems within an increasingly man-modified environment;
- An *Economic Perspective* considers a complex economic evolution including cash-cropping, wage labor, migration, education, and the impetus to development provided by such institutions as commerce and marketing;
- A *Spatial Perspective* explores geographical patterns of cultural, ecological, and economic change, written in history and upon the landscape.

Taken together, these four viewpoints paint a detailed portrait of rural modernization in Africa that will have many ramifications on questions like rural planning, population growth, increased accessibility to national and international markets, and the progress of African socialism.

Page proofs will be sent, if necessary by airmail, to each contributor (or his nominee) provided that the Editors have been given an address through which he can be reached without delay. Corrections should be kept to the minimum, and should be corrections, not new material. If they are to be incorporated in the master proof corrected by the Editors, it is important that the contributor should return the page proofs, by airmail if necessary, to the Editor named when they are sent out (and *not* to the Cambridge University Press), within ten days of his receipt of them.

Contributors of articles and review articles receive 25 free separates. Additional separates may be obtained at reasonable cost, provided that they are ordered before publication on the special form sent out with the galley proofs.
