The division of Christendom into the Greek East and the Latin West has its origin far back in history, but its consequences still affect Europe, and thus Western Civilization. As a Westerner with an unusual knowledge of, and sympathy for, the Greek Christian metaphysical and mystical tradition, Dr Sherrard expounds the fundamental character of Greek Orthodox thought and its differences from the Western outlook, tracing their divergence from its origins down to recent times. He shows also how the Greek world has been affected by the impact, since the later eighteenth century, of modern Western ideas fundamentally alien to it. His point of view and the facts he adduces will be of interest to historians of the Church and of Europe, as well as to theologians.
