Applications are invited for the post of Senior Lecturer in Adult Psychiatry within the Department of Psychological Medicine of the Faculty of Medicine, Dunedin.

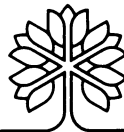
Private treatment of anorexia nervosa

A specialist unit for the treatment of anorexia nervosa has been established at Bowden House Clinic. It is led by a consultant psychiatrist with a special interest and experience in the management of the condition, supported by a team of nurses and therapists trained in the care of anorexic patients.

Referring psychiatrists and physicians are given full facilities to work closely with the team so that they may themselves provide continuing care after in-patient treatment.

Bowden House Clinic – a member of the St. Andrew's Hospital Group of private psychiatric hospitals – is only 30 minutes by road from central London. Subscribers to private medical insurance schemes may be able to claim within the terms of their cover for treatment at the clinic.
