Although in the days of Roman physician Celsus surgery was in its embryonic stages, his admonition is pertinent even in these enlightened times.

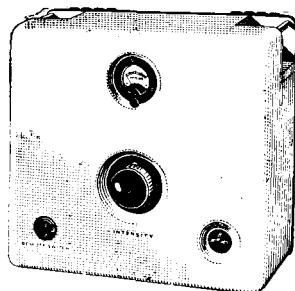
