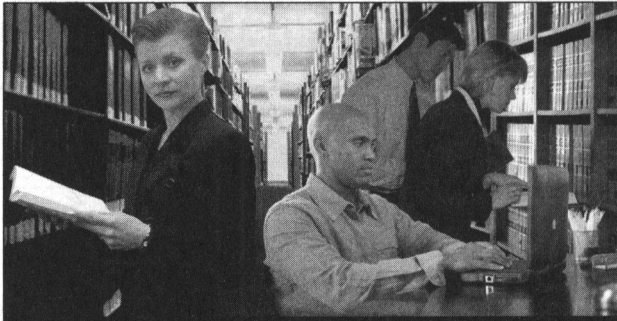

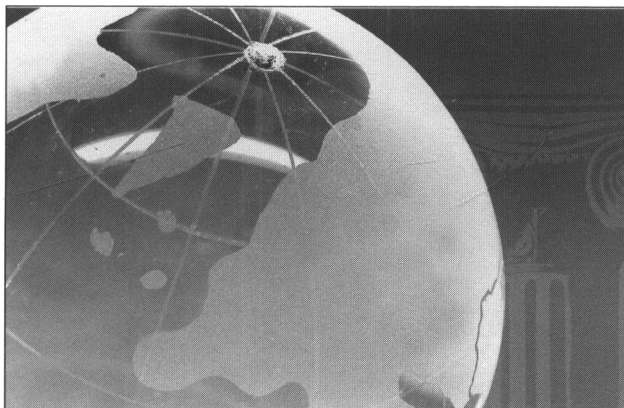

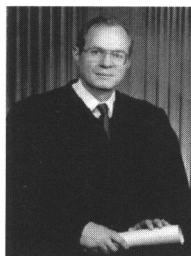

*Consequences of the Construction of a Wall in the Occupied Palestinian Territory*

The ICJ can label that the specific regime imposed there for the wall in the occupied territories, and can also  
reason to draw its necessary inferences to hold that the construction was unlawful by virtue of interna-

*Supreme Court of Israel: Beit Souraski Village Council v. The Government of Israel*

The Supreme Court of Israel ordered that the construction of a wall in the area of the West Bank be

alternative route.

The Appeals Chamber of the Special Court for Sierra Leone held that the requirement of child soldiers in a  
warfare is a violation of international law.

*United States Supreme Court: Shatry Rawls v. George W. Bush*

The U.S. District Court held that the defendant's failure to disclose the  
method employed to identify the defendant with correct names and addresses  
of an extradition was fatal.

1225  
*Final Appeals: Ocalda Torres v. The State of Oklahoma*

A federal court held that the defendant's extradition to the state of Oklahoma was  
in violation of the defendant's rights and interests in the District
