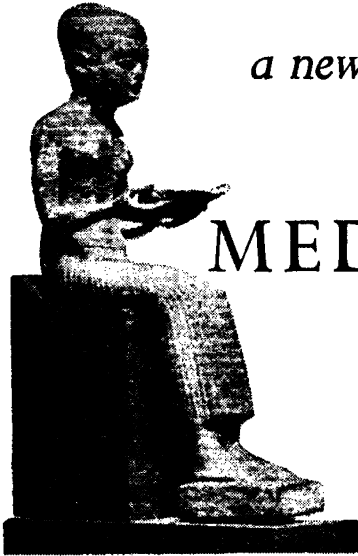

Thomas Geminus. **COMPENDIOSA TOTIUS ANATOMIE DELINEATIO.** A facsimile of the first English edition of 1553 in the version of Nicholas Udall. With an introduction by C. D. O'Malley.

In 1545 Thomas Geminus of Leeds published this book in Latin, taken entirely from Vesalius. In the preface he mentions Vesalius and boasts that his book is just as good as the original. It was very successful and, as de Feyfer says, it did more to make the work of Vesalius known than his own book. The plates, taken from the *Fabrica*, were the first anatomical engravings to be produced in England.

DOCTORS MONRO: a medical saga. By Rex E. Wright-St.Clair. pp. xiii, 190, *ports.*, 1964. 30s. (\$5.00).

Dr. Wright-St.Clair traces the story of the remarkable family which, in the persons of the three Alexanders Monro, dominated medical education at Edinburgh for 126 years, and which in the course of eight generations has produced eleven distinguished doctors. The story is based on unpublished material from the main Monro collections of documents in Edinburgh, Dunedin (where they were deposited by Sir David Monro's descendants), and in private hands, as well as the Minutes of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons and Physicians of Edinburgh and the Edinburgh Town Council.

MEDICAL ILLUSTRATIONS IN MEDIEVAL MANUSCRIPTS.

By Loren MacKinney. pp. xix, 190 (+ index), 18 col. plates, 86 black and white illus., 1964.

This magnificently illustrated book is the fruit of thirty years patient study of the major manuscript collections of Europe and the United States. The 104 miniatures selected from these sources reflect the breadth and depth of the healing art as practised in the Western world during the late medieval period before the new learning of the Renaissance revolutionized the practice of medicine. In addition to his detailed study of the important texts Professor MacKinney has provided a checklist of medical miniatures in manuscripts which will prove an indispensable research tool for scholars interested in medieval medical history.

THE MEDICAL HISTORY OF MALTA. By Paul Cassar. pp. approx. 536, illus., 1964. 75s. (\$12.00).

From the beginning of history, Malta has been at the very heart of the Western world, open to and reflecting all the diverse influences of the Mediterranean civilizations. The rule of the powerful Order of St John of Jerusalem gave the island a special connection with public health and medical care so that its medical history offers a unique cross-section of the progress of the whole of Western medicine.
