



*Taifa* is an account of how nation and race emerged out of the legal, social, and economic histories in one major city, Dar es Salaam. Nation and race were not simply universal ideas brought to Africa by European colonizers, as previous studies assume. They were instead categories crafted by local African thinkers to make sense of deep inequalities, particularly those between local Africans and Indian immigrants. *Taifa* shows how nation and race became the key political categories to guide colonial and postcolonial life in this African city.
