Legal efforts aimed at curbing terrorism stem from a wide variety of sources, over a substantial period of time. This book brings together the key documents on terrorism and in doing so preserves them for future reference and also enables scholars, practitioners and students to more easily and quickly compare and contrast them. The book is comprehensive in coverage (thematically, organisationally, geographically and temporally) and open to a balance of sources (hard and soft), but is nonetheless judicious in its selection and prioritisation of the most significant and representative documents, in a field where there are a great many repetitive and insubstantial documents to sift through.

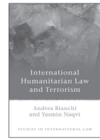
Accounting for Hunger The Right to Food in the Era of Globalisation *Edited by Olivier De Schutter and Kaitlin Cordes*

International Humanitarian Law and Terrorism *Andrea Bianchi and Yasmin Naqvi*

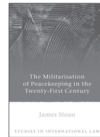
