Local Treatment

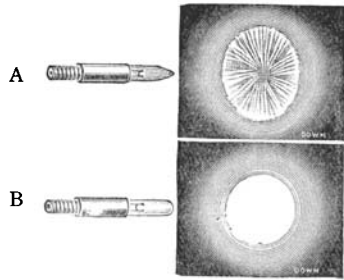

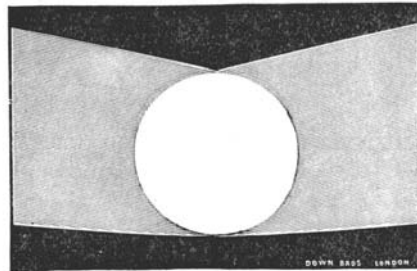

CLINICAL INSTRUCTION

Clinical Instruction in the Diagnosis and Treatment of Diseases of the Throat, Nose and Ear is given daily in the Out-patient Department from 2 to 5 p.m., and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6.30 to 8 p.m. Major operations are performed daily, except Saturdays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. Minor operations are performed in the Out-patient Department by the Assistant Surgeons on three mornings a week. Special Demonstrations are held in the Out-patient Department each Monday and Wednesday at 3 p.m.

Practitioners and Medical Students are admitted to the practice of the Hospital, and Clinical Assistants, whose duty it is to assist the staff, are appointed from time to time among them. For further information apply to the Dean, Mr. F. CUNLIFFE ORMEROD.
