

# 1982 APSA Annual Meeting

## Short Courses

APSA will offer two concurrent special courses for Annual Meeting attendees on Wednesday, September 1, the day before the official opening of the Annual Meeting. W.A.E. Skurnik of the University of Colorado at Boulder will conduct an all-day seminar on coverage of foreign news in the American press.

After a morning session which will include an analysis of available empirical data on the determinants of foreign news coverage, an afternoon panel will be convened. A representative of the wire services as well as a newspaper editor will give a brief presentation which will be followed by audience participation.

In the other short course Diane Fowlkes of Georgia State University and Susette Talarico of the University of Georgia will conduct an afternoon workshop on new teaching materials on women in American politics, which can be incorporated into existing American government courses.

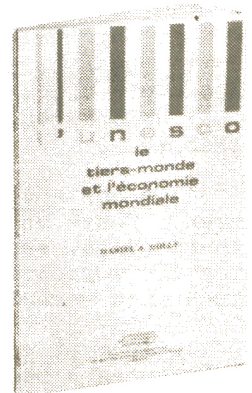
