The story of St Cuthbert throws much light on the secular history of Northumbria, and on that period in the history of the English Church when a choice had to be made between the Celtic and Roman forms. Thirty-eight MSS. of Bede's prose *Life*, and seven MSS. of the *Life* by an anonymous monk of Lindisfarne on which Bede's version was based, have been traced and collated for this edition of the texts, with parallel translations, of the two *Lives* of St Cuthbert, which also forms a welcome beginning for a much-needed edition of the works of Bede.
