For the third edition of this internationally acclaimed text, revisions and additions have been made in the sections covering the post-Stalin period and in the bibliography and list of readings in English. These reflect both domestic and foreign policy developments and the findings of scholarship since the publication of the previous edition in 1969.

On the domestic front, Professor Riasanovsky offers new material on a range of subjects: the slowing down of the economy, the program for the Tenth Five-Year Plan, instituted in 1976; the Twenty-Fifth Party Congress of December 1975; dissent among intellectuals and increased activity and interest in the *samizdat* movement; and Jewish emigration. In the area of foreign policy, he focuses on the development and subsequent uncertainty of detente, and relations with China and the Eastern European states since Soviet intervention in Czechoslovakia in 1968.

This is the first full-length study in English of the early years of the VCheka, the All-Russian Extraordinary Commission, and its successors, the GPU and OGPU. In the course of his research, Professor Gerson has examined many unpublished Soviet and Western official documents pertaining to the origins and development of the secret police.

During the formative period of the Soviet state, the VCheka served as the guardian of the Bolshevik dictatorship. It crushed hundreds of popular uprisings, sealed Russian borders, secured transportation lines, and suppressed anti-Bolshevik groups. Incongruously, it also initiated relief programs for thousands of orphans created by the Revolution. Indeed there was hardly any area of Soviet life which escaped its surveillance or was immune from its repressive measures.
