This edition presents official reports written for the Foreign Office by British envoys to the States of the German Confederation (1815-1866).

Volume II covers the period of German Vormärz from the July Revolution 1830 to 1847. All despatches are transcribed and annotated for the first time.

The following missions are included: Frankfurt (Diet of the German Confederation), Berlin (Prussia), Munich (Bavaria), Stuttgart (Württemberg), Dresden (Saxony), Vienna (Austria) and Hanover. The selection reveals the attitudes of British diplomats to the political, economic, military, cultural, and social situation in the German states.
