Federal Receipts and Expenditures During Business Cycles, 1879-1958

By John M. Firestone

This study analyzes for the first time how revenue collections and expenditures of the U.S. federal government have moved during business cycles from 1879 to the present. The analysis is divided into five time periods: ten business cycles from 1879-1914; four interwar cycles, 1921-1938; three wartime cycles, including the two world wars and the Korean conflict; two postwar cycles, 1919-1921 and 1945-1949; and the most recent cycle, 1954-1958. Although sources of revenue and objects of expenditure have changed radically over the past 80 years, the author discerns a surprisingly persistent behavior pattern in the record of federal receipts and disbursements as they relate to business cycles. *Published for the National Bureau of Economic Research.* 192 pages.
