- We did not lose in Vietnam. A startling conclusion to draw from what is widely regarded as an overwhelming American defeat? Of course it is—until Eugene Massengale puts that “defeat” and Indochina into the context of the Nixon Doctrine. And that throws new light on that Doctrine and its consequences.
- J.W. Fulbright continues his keen analysis and assessment of the Middle East as he looks beyond the Sinai agreement. The implications of that agreement are by no means clear, he argues, and then proceeds to outline different possibilities. Neither polls nor organized minorities should be allowed to divert the main actors from policies that can lead to an era of peace and unrivaled prosperity in the Middle East
