After the overthrow of the Ch'ing dynasty in 1911, China entered the first stage of its long search for a modern political system—the warlord years. By using a unique case-study technique, the author, Professor of Political Science at MIT, re-evaluates this critical period in Chinese history, which most scholars characterize as chaotic and negative. With rare perception and precision, Professor Pye analyzes the relationships among warlords, their coalitions, and their cabinets, as well as the problems they faced. His critical conclusion opens up new vistas for China-scholars.
