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
English Language & Linguistics, published three times a year, is an international journal which focuses on the description of the English language within the framework of contemporary linguistics. The journal is concerned equally with the synchronic and the diachronic aspects of English language studies and publishes articles of the highest quality which make a substantial contribution to our understanding of the structure and development of the English language and which are informed by a knowledge and appreciation of linguistic theory. *English Language & Linguistics* carries articles and short discussion papers or squibs on all core aspects of English, from its beginnings to the present day, including syntax, morphology, phonology, semantics, pragmatics, corpus linguistics and lexis.

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Phonology, published three times a year, is the only journal devoted exclusively to the discipline, and provides a unique forum for the productive interchange of ideas among phonologists and those working in related disciplines.

Preference is given to papers which make a substantial theoretical contribution, irrespective of the particular theoretical framework employed, but the submission of papers presenting new empirical data of general theoretical interest is also encouraged.

The journal carries research articles, as well as book reviews and shorter pieces on topics of current controversy within phonology.



The journal brings together research from the English - and French - speaking traditions, publishing significant work on French phonology, morphology, syntax, lexis and semantics, discourse-pragmatics, sociolinguistics and variation studies. Most work is synchronic in orientation, but historical and comparative items are also included. Studies of the acquisition of the French language, where these take due account of current theory in linguistics and applied linguistics, are also published.

The *Journal of the International Phonetic Association* (JIPA) is a forum for work in the fields of phonetic theory and description. As well as including papers on laboratory phonetics/phonology and related topics, the journal encourages submissions on practical applications of phonetics to areas such as phonetics teaching and speech therapy, as well as the analysis of speech phenomena in relation to computer speech processing. It is especially concerned with the theory behind the International Phonetic Alphabet and discussions of the use of symbols for illustrating the phonetic structures of a wide variety of languages. JIPA now publishes online audio files to supplement written articles.

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The Nordic Association of Linguists (NAL) is an organisation whose aim is to promote the interests of linguists, especially those working in the Nordic countries, and of linguists working specifically with the languages of the Nordic countries.

The activities of the NAL include:

- the *Nordic Journal of Linguistics*, published for the Association by Cambridge University Press
- two conference series, the Scandinavian Conference of Linguistics and the International Conference on Nordic and General Linguistics, organised under the auspices of the Association (proceedings are published for both series)
- some financial support to graduate students in Nordic languages or linguistics
