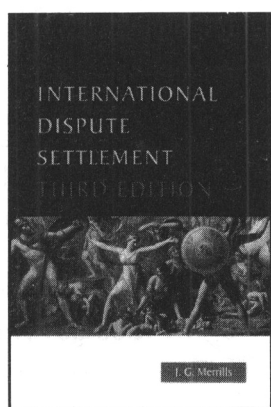

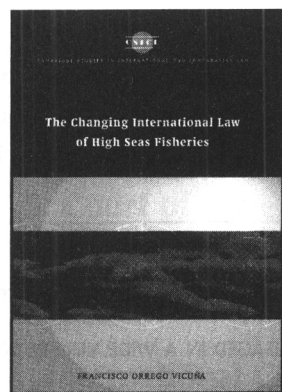
The Changing International Law of High Seas Fisheries

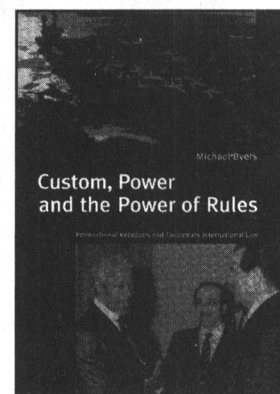
Custom, Power and the Power of Rules

The instruction combines a review of the standard terminology of the U.S. legal system with a study of sentence and paragraph structures that characterizes legal writing.

The Orientation will take place at **The George Washington University Law School**, Washington, D.C., the oldest law school in the nation's capital. Located within a few blocks of the White House and The World Bank, the Law School offers one of the finest environments for legal training in the U.S. and international legal community. There is no better place than Washington to study the American legal system, as it is the center of the nation's judicial, legislative and executive branches. It is also one of the major cultural centers in the United States.
