What >>> Help shape science and technology policy in Washington, DC:

Contribute scientific and technical information and external perspectives to federal decisionmaking, while learning how government works. The AAAS fellowship programs provide a unique participatory public policy experience for scientists and engineers, through one-year assignments involving domestic and international science policy issues in the Congress and several executive branch agencies. Stipends typically range from \$48,000 to \$52,000.

Who >>> Applicants must have a Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral level degree at the time of application in any physical, biological or social science, any field of engineering, or any relevant interdisciplinary field. Engineers with a master's degree and three years of post-degree experience also may apply. U.S. citizenship is required. Federal employees are not eligible. Political scientists are especially encouraged to apply. Approximately 50 fellowships are awarded each year, in nine different programs.

When >>> The fellowship year begins September 1, 2001. Fellows attend a two-week orientation before beginning their assignments, and participate in a yearlong seminar series on topics relevant to science, technology, and public policy. **Application deadline is January 10, 2001.**

Where >>> Fellows are placed in the Congress, the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the Department of State, the Department of Defense, the Agency for International Development, the Environmental Protection Agency, the Department of Agriculture, the Food and Drug Administration, the Department of Justice, and other federal offices.

Why >>> AAAS sponsors these programs to provide the opportunity for accomplished and societally aware scientists and engineers to participate in and contribute to the public policymaking process of the federal government. The programs include:

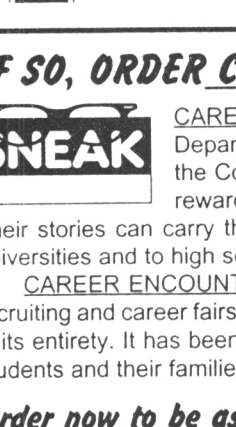

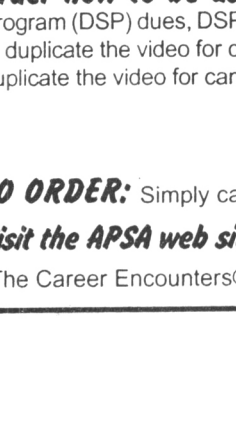

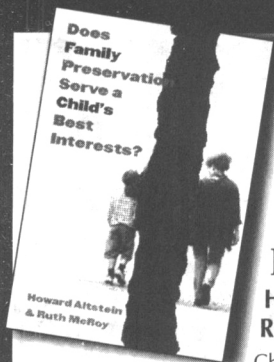


Visiting Research Fellowships 2001-2002
