Human Sexuality and Its Problems

A comprehensive and scholarly account of the determinants of human sexuality and its problems, covering all important aspects of the subject in one volume.

The book is divided into two main parts:

Part one deals with sexual development and the anatomy, physiology, biochemistry and endocrinology of sexual behaviour, in addition to sociological and psychological aspects. Topics covered include: heterosexuality, homosexuality, other sexual minor minorities.

Part two is concerned with sexual problems—how they present, their causation, and how they can be helped. Aspects covered include: * methods of treatment and current use * simple counselling * types of therapy * the use of surrogate partners and sexual aids * the therapeutic aids of drugs and hormones. There are also chapters on sexual aspects of medical practice, sexual aspects of fertility control and infertility, and sexual offences.

This new position has been established to co-ordinate the Mental Health Services for the elderly population of Victoria. The successful applicant will be responsible for the development and recommendations of broad policies in relation to the care of the elderly requiring mental health services. He will facilitate by consultation and liaison the development of such services in the various Mental Health Division hospitals and clinics and the integration of such services with each of those provided by other hospitals and institutions.

The appointee will be administratively responsible to the Assistant Director (Clinical Services) of the Mental Health Division.

Applicants should have evidence of significant specialist experience within the field of psycho-geriatrics.

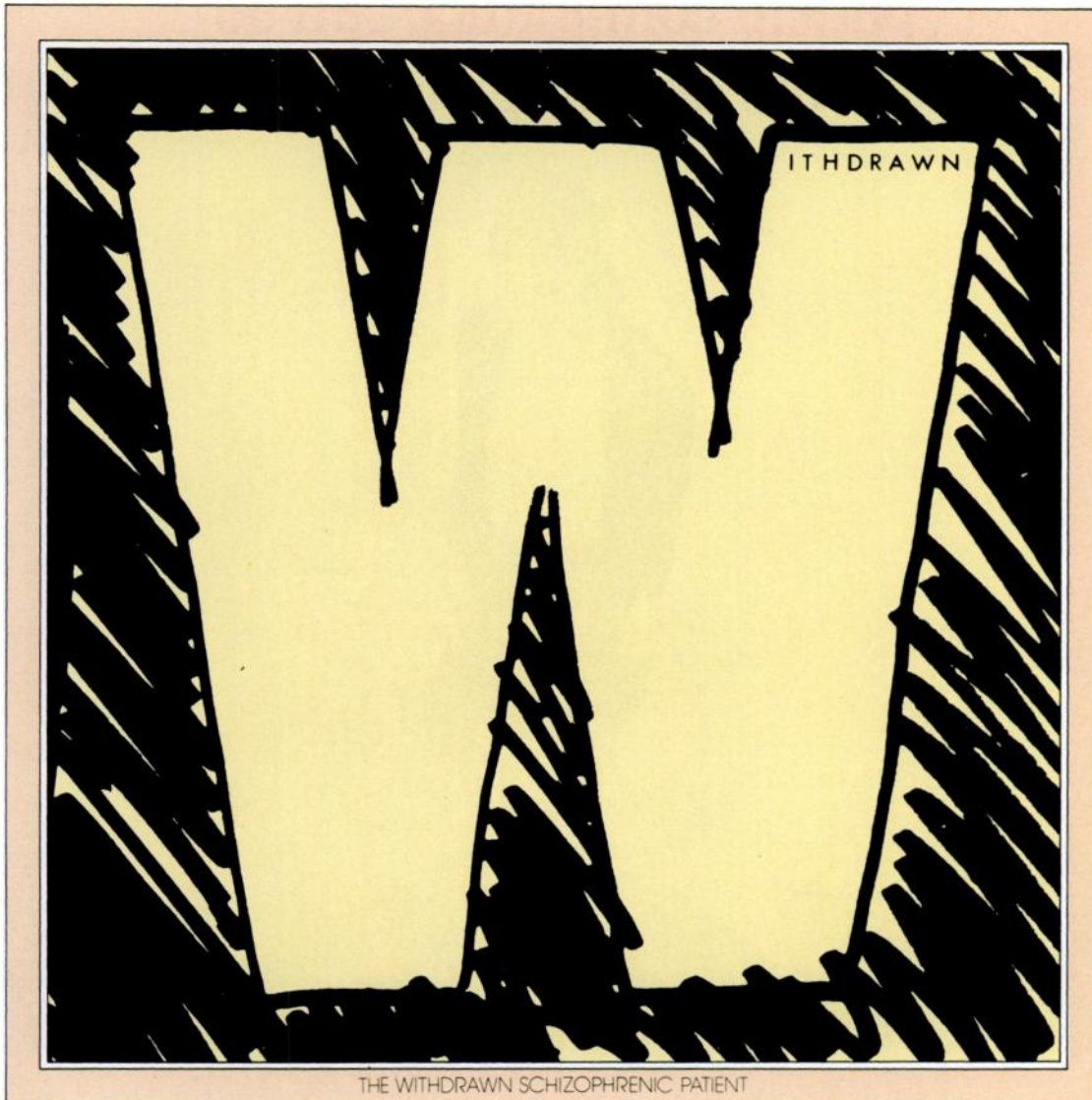

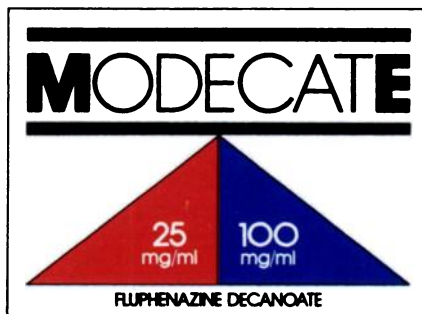

THE WITHDRAWN SCHIZOPHRENIC PATIENT

The flexible approach to schizophrenia therapy
