In note 4 to her letter on Miss Lenore Coral's 'Playford Advertisement' (R. M. A. Research Chronicle No. 5), Miss Margaret Dean-Smith mentions "a letter from the late Arundell Esdaile on idiosyncrasies of redating his collection of tracts by George Thomason".

Not all readers of the Research Chronicle may know that this refers to the collection of Civil War tracts made (not written) by George Thomason and presented to the British Museum by George III in 1762. Miss Dean-Smith's use of "his" strongly suggests that the collection belonged to the late Dr Esdaile, a suggestion which would, I am sure, have horrified him. As Miss Dean-Smith herself writes, "bibliographical details should be precise".
