Justice removed, then, what are kingdoms but great bands of robbers? What are bands of robbers themselves but little kingdoms? The band itself is made up of men; it is governed by the authority of a ruler; it is bound together by a pact of association; and the loot is divided according to an agreed law. If, by the constant addition of desperate men, this scourge grows to such a size that it acquires territory, establishes a seat of government, occupies cities, and subjugates peoples, it assumes the name kingdom more openly. For this name is now manifestly conferred upon it by not by the removal of greed, but by the addition of impunity. —Augustine, *On the City of God*, book IV, ch. 4. Trans. R. W. Dyson
