Athenagoras: *Legatio* and *De Resurrectione

In the *Legatio* Athenagoras deals with the charge of 'atheism' so often levelled against the early Church in the Roman Empire. His efforts to reorientate the social and religious ideas of the Romans helps us to see the situation as many early Christians must have seen it, and this makes the work of great importance to the historian and theologian. £2·50

That of the *De Lapsis* is here published for the first time, that of the *De Unitate* is reproduced from the author's *The Tradition of Manuscripts* (1961). Athanasius: *Contra Gentes* and *De Incarnatione*

Despite the importance of Athanasius's *Contra Gentes—De Incarnatione* no critical edition has previously been published. One of its most interesting features is that two recensions are known. The longer, authentically Athanasian one is here translated into English, while the variants of the 'short' (unauthentic) version have been indicated in the apparatus to the Greek text. £3·25

In the second and third centuries A.D. Alexandria was the meeting-point of three distinct cultural streams, the Jewish-Alexandrine philosophy, Platonism, and Gnosticism, all of which had an influence on Alexandrine orthodox Christianity.
