The University of Miami's North-South Center offers you online access to more than 60,000 abstracts on current Latin American topics through the INFO-SOUTH database. Every month we add over 1,000 summaries of critical articles selected primarily from the region's top 40 newspapers and news magazines.

### Here's how it works:

Set up an INFO-SOUTH user code by calling our customer service desk at 305-284-4414. Then call the database through your modem, anytime, 24 hours a day. A quick search will tell you what's available. You can read the summaries, copy them, or ask for immediate FAX delivery of the documents. A typical search costs \$40.

INFO-SOUTH has recently made several changes to speed its service:

**Accelerated abstracting.** Most abstracts are now online within two weeks of publication. Citations appear almost immediately.

**New "mini-abstracts."** Brief summaries of speeches or documents by major Latin American political leaders alert users to policy shifts.

**Free trial access.** Prospective users will receive one week's free access to the database.
