The first edition of this book was designed to satisfy the growing demand for a survey of the whole field of family law, and the subjects covered in the second edition are: formation, annulment and dissolution of marriage; the law of husband and wife, with particular reference to property rights and the rights of married women; the law of parent and child; guardian and ward; family provision; child law; procedure in matrimonial causes; and conflict of laws. These last two have been added in this edition, primarily for students taking the Solicitors' qualifying examination.

The case law has now been brought up to date to 1st January, 1965, (but *National Provincial Bank Ltd. v. Ainsworth* is dealt with in an Addendum), and reference has been made to more than twenty statutes passed since the publication of the first edition.
